Easter Brings Renewed Hope

After the quiet, inner searching depth of Lent and the shadows of Holy Week, Easter comes like a breath of fresh air, bringing renewed hope. It comes with an astonishing truth that life has overcome death; love has overcome fear and hope has overcome despair. Alleluia! Christ is Risen!

Luke's account of the resurrection stated, "*But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb*" (Luke chapter 24 verses 1-2 The Bible)

The women came to perform an ultimate act of love, because this was the normal, faithful way to care for a body after death in first-century Jewish burial customs. Due to the start of Sabbath, they could not fully honour the body of Jesus, so they returned at the earliest possible moment, only to be met with the most astounding news. They were expecting to encounter sorrow, but hope had already arrived; expecting to find death, but life had already broken through; expecting to stand outside a closed tomb, but God had already opened the way. The stone was rolled away, and nothing is the same.

The stone was rolled away not to let Jesus out, but to let us in to witness God's power is greater than anything that tries to hold us captive. More so, God is already ahead of us rolling away stones we thought were permanent, reminding us that despair does not have the final say. Let us discover again joy where we may expect sorrow; peace in times of worry and renewed hope this Easter.
